2024: A YEAR OF COLLECTIVE CLIMATE IMPACT.

Partnering with communities, we made climate solutions more accessible through education, incentives, and hands-on programs. From cutting emissions to expanding clean mobility and energy efficiency, we served 44,844 people— empowering them to be part of the solution. Together, we helped avoid over 25 metric tons of GHG emissions, proving that collective action drives a healthier, more sustainable future.

With the help of thousands of partners and community members, we made tangible progress towards our mission: to advance equitable community climate solutions in 2024.

Complete Streets

Formalized in 2024, the Complete Streets Initiative is a visionary project designed to transform transportation in Santa Cruz County by creating a safe, comfortable, and accessible transportation network. Inspired by the thriving transportation ecosystem of the Netherlands and case studies like the city of Austin, Complete Streets will drastically reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, lower injury and death rates, and transform public spaces into vibrant, livable environments. This project will benefit people of all ages, abilities, and socioeconomic backgrounds, ensuring that equity and inclusion are central to its development.

Community Climate Resilience

2024 was a big year for our regional resiliency initiatives. The Monterey Bay Climate Justice Collaborative gained traction by adopting a consensus Governance Charter, growing to 45 members, and securing over \$1.2M for community-driven climate resilience work.

Our Resilient Central Coast program continued to empower people with the knowledge, tools, and resources to build a more sustainable and climate-ready future.

To date, program participants have committed over 12,000 sustainable actions.

In 2024, we partnered with 40+ community-based organizations & municipal departments to build capacity and advance equity-focused community climate resilience.

Active Transportation

Modo is redefining how we move by making sustainable transportation options more accessible, safe, and convenient for all. In 2024, Modo continued to empower communities to choose active and low-carbon ways to get around through bike education, infrastructure advocacy, and e-mobility programs. By reducing barriers to biking and clean transportation, we're building a future where everyone has the freedom to move sustainably.

BUILDING COMMUNITY WITH MOVEMENT

The Modo team facilitated scores of community events in 2024, including Walk and Roll to School Days in the Spring and Fall with 37 schools and at least 3,364 students participating.

Energy and Building Decarbonization

In 2024, our energy efficiency and building decarbonization initiatives helped commercial building owners reduce emissions, improve energy efficiency, and reduce costs. Through expert guidance, seamless project execution, and access to funding, we turned sustainability goals into measurable wins for decarbonization.

POWERING GHG REDUCTIONS:

In 2024, our energy initiatives realized 20,971 MT CO2e emissions avoided through multiple new energy efficiency and decarbonization offerings.

Electric Vehicles & Infrastructure

EVs for Everyone continued to remove barriers to clean transportation, helping under-served communities switch to electric vehicles through financial aid, education, and hands-on support.

In 2024, Ecology Action expanded EV charging access for businesses and multifamily property owners—providing site assessments, installation, and funding support to meet growing demand. By making EV adoption and charging more accessible, we're driving a cleaner future.






Our Financials: Funding Community Climate Solutions

How funding is distributed across our organization




